1834	 Sept. and Oct The city of Saint John suffers an epidemic of cholera. The death toll is approximately fifty people. New Brunswick legislation and boards of health push for quarantines, limiting the spread of the disease. 	
1918	26 Apr Public Health Act passes, founding the province's Department of Health. It will not come into effect until October.William F. Roberts becomes the first Minister	CO CO
1918	of Health in the entire British Empire. Early Oct. - New Brunswick experiences its first cases and, subsequently, deaths of the Spanish Influenza. Schools, theatres, and churches close on 11 October.	
1918	Nov While the province celebrates the end of The Great War, it also endures the height of the pandemic. Public buildings reopen on 18 November.	
1919	Jan By the end of the month, influenza fades off in the province. Nevertheless, public health officials and citizens are wary of another outbreak.






